Therefore, our "**Power of 7**" vision focuses on relationships; each one of us connecting with **7** people we can lead toward Christ; and together all of us connecting with other individuals in **70** neighborhoods, **7** cities and **7** countries for the intentional purpose of connecting them with Jesus that that they can experience His greater life.

This Ministry Plan presents our strategies for fulfilling this vision in 2017.





Jamie is one of seven relationships that I've been intentionally pursuing to share my hope in Christ. Jamie works at his parent's auto service center. Several years back, I took my car there for service and I asked Jamie about his spiritual life. I shared briefly about Christ's offer to all of us, and after some time Jamie accepted Christ as his Savior.

It was 8 years before he took his next step. The Sunday after Easter this year, he was watching the live stream service from his home. That Sunday I challenged

anyone who has already committed their life to Christ but not yet been baptized, to take the next step and be baptized. Jamie emailed me after that service, and we started meeting for lunch every other week to talk about baptism and learn what it means to be a committed Christ-follower. Jay's Story

Melissa's Story

Melissa was invited to Columbia campus by her co-worker, Samantha. She brought Melissa to meet Pastor Eric before the service. Melissa told him, "I want to be baptized." Pastor Eric, said, "Great! We just need to schedule a date for this." "I want to do it today," she said. "I brought my change of clothes with me, and my husband and I want to join the church. The Lord spoke to me all week long telling me this is what I needed to do."

Melissa said, she and her husband now see how God moved them to this community and gave her a job where she would be drawn closer to Him through relationships with a caring church family.



In the next 7-10 years, we will create a movement of families who will share their experience of grace with their neighbors and transform their neighborhoods by showing the love of Christ. We are developing families who see their neighborhoods as their personal assignment for Christ.

God has strategically placed our church in a rapidly growing community. Our two campuses in Columbia and Thompson Station draw from over 70 neighborhoods for worship and events throughout the year.

In community surveys, our neighbors listed family problems and spiritual issues in their top five most significant concerns. Almost every family feels frayed and stretched with the pressure to be involved with everything. Families here are busy, but starving for intimacy with each other and with God, whether they realize it or not.

Grace Point Fellowship, Springboro, OH


When Reg's fifth grade son, Owen, was kicked out of school, the care they received by our Grace Point Fellowship church plant was pivotal. It was one of many touches that led Reg and Owen to put their hope in Christ. Reg's oldest son, Riley, was first invited to Grace Point's student Bible study by his girlfriend. Reg figured he needed to "check out this church." He came by himself one Sunday, and then he kept coming. As he came each week, it was clear that he was searching.

Reg eventually began to go to Pastor Rich's Bible study. His wife, Jill, started coming to small group and worship with him. One Thursday, when Pastor Reagan was meeting with Owen, he decided to give his life to Christ. Reg was baptized on Sep. 25 and on that same day he helped to baptize Owen.





Elijah Moralez grew up in San Bernardino but moved to Las Vegas four years ago. Elijah admits to not being very religious, but he started talking about faith with his new neighbor, Pastor Steve Witt. Elijah eventually agreed to try a Bible study in Steve's home in February. He started bringing his girlfriend, Camille, and his friends Tristan and Ketelyn. On September 11th Elijah brought Tristan and Ketelyn to the first Sunday service of the Well Church. Tristan and Katelyn both responded to the invitation to receive Christ. Even though Elijah is not a Christ follower yet, God is using him to lead other people to find Christ.

With the displacement and resettlement of so many unreached people groups to middle TN, we have a unique opportunity to share the love of Christ and our hope in Him with the nations right here from home. That doesn't mean we don't go overseas, but it does mean we shouldn't miss the wonderful opportunities that the Father is giving His church. We have over 50,000 Hispanic, 3,000 Chinese, and 3,000 Ethiopian people in Middle TN. The nations are literally moving next door.

More than 80,000 refugees will enter America this year. The majority will never be invited into someone's home. Many of them have never heard the name of Jesus!

What if the movement of peoples is not something to fear? What if the influx of refugees, immigrants, and international students is a blessing orchestrated by God to fulfill the Great Commission? Perhaps welcoming our local international neighbors is just as strategic in the mission for God to be glorified in every tribe, tongue, and people.

TSC is partnering with World Relief Nashville to take the Gospel in word and actions to the same people living among us as we are partnering to reach through international missions.



Thankful for...

- Over 1,000 TSC members participating together in our online prayer study and 100's partnering with one another in prayer throughout 2016
- Space provided for Wed. night Bible studies for Columbia campus.
- Hundreds of volunteer hours and over \$25,000 in donations to renovate the Missions house that will provide temporary housing for 3 or 4 missionary families per year. We're booked through 2018.
- Our children packing food at VBS to provide 24,000 meals for people in Haiti
- Our children bringing \$3,400 in change during VBS to help fund a Spring Mission Team to minister to children in Uruguay.
- Hundreds of hours of volunteer hours to renovate TS campus and provide staff offices
- \$340,000 in renovations to TS campus this summer
