BOTTOM LINE

DON'T BURY WHAT GOD CAN BUILD ON.

SCRIPTURE

"The cry of the people of Israel has reached me, and I have seen how harshly the Egyptians abuse them. Now go, for I am sending you to Pharaoh. You must lead my people Israel out of Egypt" (Exodus 3:9-10 NLT).

GOAL OF SMALL GROUP

To help students understand that God doesn't define us by our behavior.

THINK ABOUT THIS

Leaders — We would all love to have the perfect group filled with enough respect and maturity to know for sure that what is said in group stays in group. But we have to be realistic. When someone in your group begins to disclose something personal that you feel might come back to hurt him or her later, prompt discretion.

SAY THIS

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

1. What are some things people typically say to themselves when they slip up or mess up?
2. What are some lies that people believe about their *future* because of something they've done in the *past*?
3. Why do you think Moses left town after his fellow Hebrews confronted him about the murder?
4. Why is it harmful to assume God sees you the same way YOU see you?
5. What are the benefits of bringing to light the mistakes we're tempted to hide? (*Leaders, talk about how there is fear of vulnerability or rejection at first, but once they confess, it's overshadowed by grace and relief.*)
6. Why is it important *who* we confess to? What are some characteristics to look for in a person we can confess to?
7. Who is someone that you can talk to when you've messed up that will remind you of God's unfailing love for you?

TRY THIS

Leaders — Let your students know that you're available if they ever want to talk one-on-one. Tell them there's no pressure, but you're there if they need you.
